In most cases you will be able to renew your permit(s) by calling the customer contact team on 0344 980 3333 between 8am and 5pm Monday to Fridays (except bank holidays) providing that you are registered for council tax and authorise us to check council records to establish proof of residency. You will need to have a debit/credit* card to pay with. If you are claiming a free visitor permit we will need to confirm entitlement via housing benefit or council tax reduction records.



You can also renew your permit by returning this form by post with the necessary proof cheque payment (please do not send cash). Cheques should be made payable to 'Norwich City Council'. If possible, please send photocopies of documentation we cannot accept responsibility for documents sent through the post.



If your permit expires in the next five days it can also be renewed in person by visiting the customer contact centre in City Hall between 8:45am and 5pm Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Fridays (except bank holidays) and 1pm to 5pm on Wednesdays. You will need to bring in the necessary proof or provide valid ID and be prepared to give permission for us to access council records for proof of residency and/or housing benefit/council tax reduction (if applicable). Payment can be made by debit or credit card*, cash or cheque.

*Please note: there will be an additional charge of 1.9% if you pay by credit card
