In October, councillors together with council staff and representatives from Home Run Lettings, a private sector letting agency managed by the Union of UEA Students (University of East Anglia) were out in Bury Street, Onley Street, Cambridge Street, Essex, Gloucester, Leicester, Lincoln, Newmarket Street, Portland Street, Rutland Street, Trinity Street and York Street.

We specifically door knocked properties where students were known to live but who may not have been aware of the changes to the waste and recycling services introduced on 1st October as well as making sure that they put out (and returned) their bin to the boundary of their property after collections.

A total of eighty student households were spoken to during the afternoon and all were interested in the service Norwich City Council provided; they were provided with information about the changes to waste and recycling introduced in October this year, reminded when bins could be put out/brought back in and what they needed to do to ensure their bins were emptied.

Since the event the streets have been monitored and found to have considerably less bins left out on the street compared to this time last year.

There will be a total of 48 walkabouts across the city every year. These are decided locally every three months.
